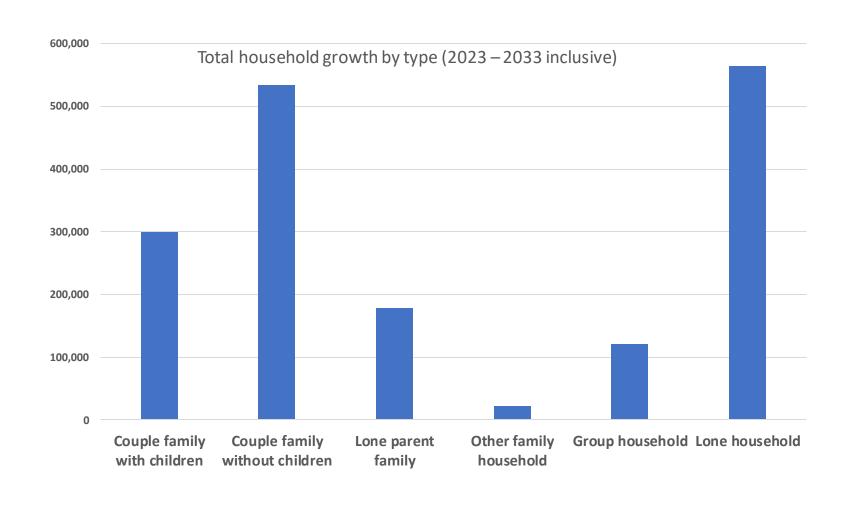
### Net overseas migration has recovered much faster than anticipated following COVID-19 border restrictions





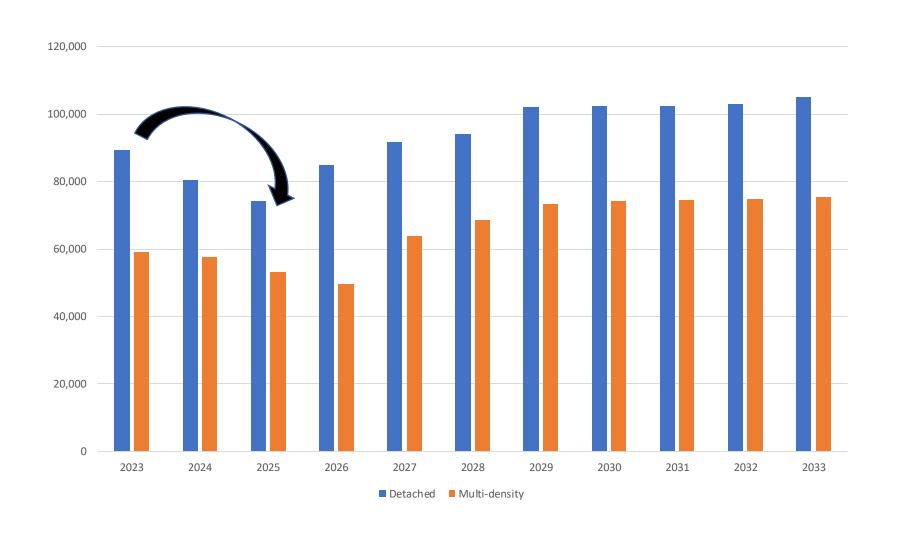
## More than 1.8m households are expected to form 2023 to 2033 (total households grow to 12.6m) with lone person households increasingly prominent





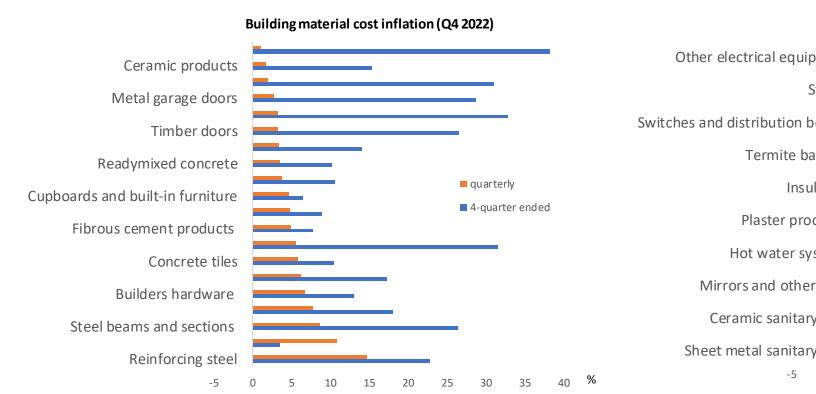
# Both detached and multi-density supply (net of demolitions) set to weaken in short term on back of higher interest rates

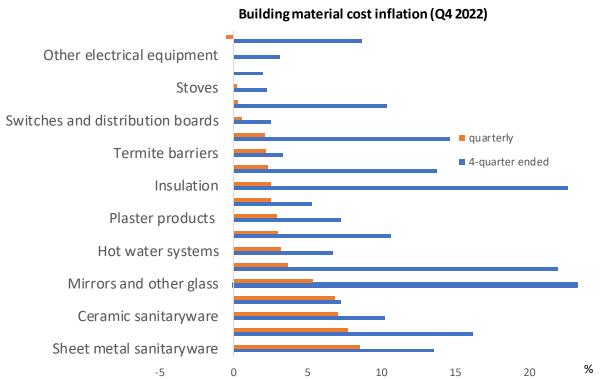




### Highest construction cost inflation in 40 years, but cost of some materials easing

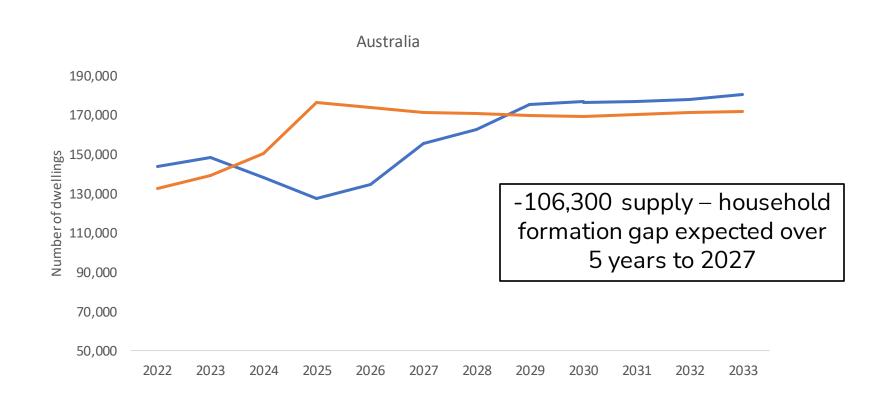






#### National annual supply-household formation balance

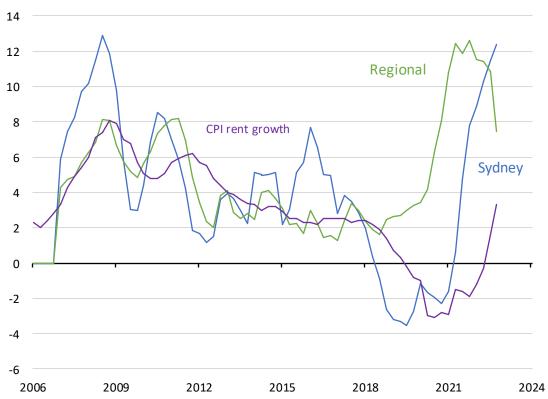




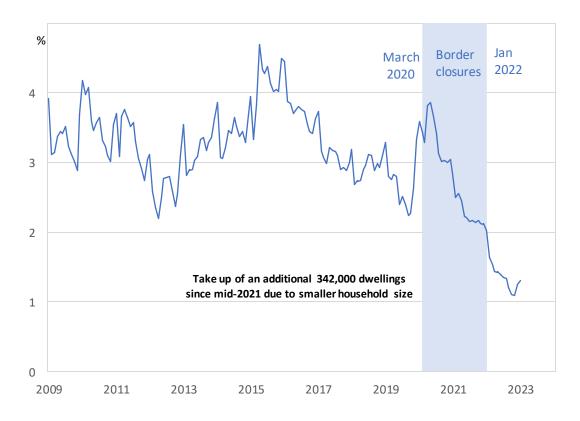
#### Rental affordability under severe pressure across most states
